# Free Meals for the Hungry

**A** For one restaurant in Montreal, the season of generosity continues year-round even though the holidays are over. In the autumn of 2016, Marché Ferdous, a family-owned Middle Eastern restaurant, started serving free meals to **1)** ..... who was hungry. The owners and chef thought no person should be hungry when food was being thrown out every night. "People sometimes come here, you have no idea by their look that they need the food and they're shy or they don't believe **2)** ..... such things. So, we told the staff, 'Don't ask any questions; do not judge them.' If they ask, just give them the food, that's it, that's all," co-owner Yahya Hashemi told CTV News.

**B** And that's what Hashemi and his team did. They put a sign on the door: "People with **3)** ..... money welcome to eat free." Marché Ferdous' charitable actions were not well known until the sign caught a customer's attention. Sean Jalbert, who had enough money for his meal, went into the restaurant to see what would happen if he asked for free food. His request for a free meal was answered just as Hashemi had stated – without any judgement. "She didn't ask anything, but

said, 'we welcome you and pick whatever you like,' including anything I wanted to drink," Jalbert wrote in a post on social media. Jalbert paid before he left. It wasn't necessary, but he knew it was the right thing to do. The restaurant soon started attracting more and more people.

**C** There is a major food wastage problem all around the world: statistically, one third of food is wasted. This is a huge problem, so for the restaurant's chef, giving food away is "not a big deal." "It doesn't matter, because at night if you **4)** ..... have leftover food, you end up throwing it out, so why not give to those in need?" said chef Abdelkader Bejaoui.

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### Cairngorm Mountain Rescue Team (CMRT)



**A** The Cairngorms is a mountain range in the Scottish Highlands, with five of the six highest mountains in Scotland. This makes it a favourite destination for climbers and hikers, but being so far north also means it can be one of the most inhospitable environments in the UK. The highest UK winds ever were recorded there (283 km/h), as well as the lowest UK temperature of -27.2°C. Snow can fall throughout the year, and blizzards are common in winter. In fact, conditions up in the Cairngorm Mountains have been compared to high-Arctic Canada and northern Norway. So it's no surprise that the Cairngorm Mountain Rescue Team (CMRT) receive an average of 45 call-outs per year.

**B** The CMRT is made up of 42 members, all of whom are volunteers, but whose regular jobs are closely connected to the mountain range. Some are mountain guides, for example, while others are ski patrollers. To be a member, you have to have a certain amount of flexibility in your job and indeed your daily life, or at least an understanding employer and family. This is because you could be called out at any time of the day or night to take part in rescues that could last for days. There are also regular training sessions, which become more intensive as winter – the time of the highest danger – approaches.

**C** People often get into difficulty when they have a fall that leaves them immobile, or when the fast-changing weather of the Cairngorms catches them by surprise. A rescue can take anything from a few hours to a number of days. If the weather permits it, rescuers can be brought up to higher ground (where most people get in trouble) by helicopter, but otherwise they use 4X4s or snowmobiles to get to the closest point and then start walking. On the way, they need to be on their guard for avalanches and other hazards that could turn them from rescuers into victims in a moment.

**D** Amazingly, the CMRT receives only 20% of its funding from the government, and a further 10% from the Scottish police. The rest is made up of direct donations, often coming from mountaineers and walkers who come to the area, as well as the residents of the area, and the grateful families and friends of people they rescue. There is also a website (cmrt.org.uk) where people can make online contributions. The shortfall is made up with fundraising drives, such as the annual sponsored New Year dip in the icy waters of Loch Insh.
