

Present perfect simple

Remember!

We use the past participle of the main verb to form the present perfect simple tense. The past participle is sometimes the same as the past simple form, but not always.

Affirmative

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I/you/we/they have finished/I've/you've/we've/they've finished he/she/it has finished/he's/she's/it's finished

Negative

I/you/we/they haven't finished he/she/it hasn't finished

Questions

Have I/you/we/they finished? Has he/she/it finished?

Short answers

Yes, I/you/we/they have./ No, I/you/we/they haven't. Yes, he/she/it has./ No, he/she/it hasn't.

We haven't eaten yet. Have you eaten yet? just = a very short while before now I've just seen Tom Cruise at the airport. already = at some time before now

Mum's already visited China three times.

yet = until now
