POLITICS TODAY

Are you a political animal? Even if the answer is no, politics plays a major part in our lives. Our reporter, Tony Clarkson, asked some of our young readers, who are yet to vote in their first general election, what their views on political issues are and what politics means to them.

- A My parents are very vocal about political issues, so I suppose most people would assume that my opinions and views on such matters are the same as theirs. I guess it would be a fair assumption, given how much they always talk about activism and changing the world. However, people would probably be surprised to hear that my political position couldn't be more different to theirs. My views are much more conservative, and I made my mind up a long time ago to vote for a centre right party when I have my chance to cast my vote.
- **B** When I talk to my friends, they talk about their frustration at the system. Most people I know think that all the political parties are the same and it makes no difference which one is in power. When I tell them to do something and change the system from inside like I want to, they don't want to know. I try to tell people how important having a vote is and that by not voting you leave the door open to extremism, but they don't listen. I mean our grandparents' generation even fought in wars so we could have a vote and gave their lives for democracy and freedom. I can't imagine anyone doing that anymore...
- C Personally, I'm quite passionate about politics. I studied it at school and university and it's always appealed to me. Having said that though, I'm still undecided about who I will vote for at the next election. You see, I had planned to vote for one party but recent events have destroyed my confidence in them. There have been so many scandals that have just come to light that it's really worried me and made me totally rethink that party. Now I have to make a very difficult decision. Do I stand by my social beliefs, or do I vote for someone on the opposite side of the spectrum who hasn't been involved in corruption?
- D In my social circle people are pretty political, actually. Most of my friends care about social issues and political topics and we were all members of a youth parliament scheme when we were at school. A lot of my classmates learnt about politics there and decided to get involved in politics after taking part in that programme. Personally, I got all my political beliefs from my mum and dad. That's not to say that I just copied them and did what was expected. I genuinely share their principles and perspectives on lots of things.
