Placement Test

Wstęp

Niniejszy test poziomujący (*placement test*) ma za zadanie pomóc nauczycielowi w ustaleniu poziomu znajomości języka angielskiego przez uczniów rozpoczynających naukę w szkole ponadpodstawowej i ponadgimnazjalnej. Ponadto ułatwia podjęcie decyzji odnośnie wyboru właściwego poziomu podręcznika z serii *New Enterprise* (A1, A2 i B1).

Charakterystyka testu i opis jego przeprowadzenia

Test został podzielony na trzy części: *Grammar Part* – sprawdzającą znajomość struktur gramatycznych, *Vocabulary Part* – sprawdzającą stopień opanowania słownictwa oraz *Reading Part* – testującą umiejętność rozumienia tekstów pisanych i stosowania struktur leksykalno-gramatycznych. Test zawiera 100 zadań typu wybór wielokrotny z możliwymi odpowiedziami A, B, C lub D, spośród których tylko jedna odpowiedź jest poprawna. W teście poziomującym nie zastosowano zadań otwartych. Taki dobór formuły testu pozwala na jego przeprowadzenie w ciągu nie więcej niż jednej jednostki lekcyjnej oraz umożliwia łatwe i szybkie sprawdzenie wyników.

Pytania zostały ułożone zgodnie z rosnącym stopniem trudności. Za wykonanie testu można uzyskać maksymalnie 100 punktów – 55 punktów za część gramatyczną, 25 punktów za część leksykalną oraz 20 punktów za część opartą na czytaniu. Za każdą poprawną odpowiedź rozwiązujący test otrzymuje 1 punkt. Klucz odpowiedzi został umieszczony na końcu dokumentu.

Czas przewidziany na rozwiązanie testu powinien wynosić około 45 minut.

Interpretacja wyników

Suma zdobytych punktów określa gotowość ucznia do podjęcia pracy z podręcznikiem na danym poziomie. W przypadku wartości granicznych należy indywidualnie rozważyć zaklasyfikowanie ucznia do wyższego lub niższego poziomu.
