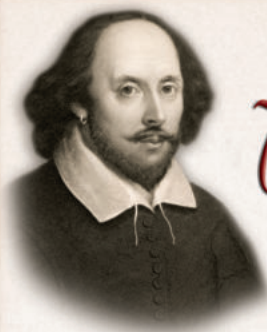

William Shakespeare

William Shakespeare is England's most famous playwright. He was born in a small town called Stratford-upon-Avon in 1564, the third of eight children. On 28 November 1582, 18-year-old Shakespeare married 26-year-old Anne Hathaway. They had three children: Susanna, born in 1583, and twins, Hamnet and Judith, born in 1585.

Little is known about Shakespeare's life between 1585 and 1592, but at some time during this period he moved to London and became involved in the theatre. By 1592 he had become a well-known actor and playwright.

When King James came to the throne in 1603, he chose Shakespeare's group of actors to become 'The King's Men'.

Around this time, Shakespeare wrote some of his most famous tragedies, including *Hamlet*, *Macbeth* and *King Lear*. Shakespeare also wrote many comedies, including *A Midsummer Night's Dream* and *As You Like It*. Most of these plays were performed at the famous Globe Theatre, built in 1599.

Shakespeare moved back to Stratford, where he spent the last few years of his life. He died there on 23 April 1616.

A Midsummer Night's Dream

A Midsummer Night's Dream was probably written in 1594 and first performed in 1595. Some people believe it was written to be performed at an important wedding. It was written around the same time as *Romeo and Juliet* and there are similarities between the two plays, even though one is a tragedy and the other a comedy. Both plays are about love, young lovers, and the problems they have because they are in love. In *A Midsummer Night's Dream*, some very bad actors perform a play called *Pyramus and Thisbe*, which many people believe is a funny version of *Romeo and Juliet*.


Theatre was very different when *A Midsummer Night's Dream* was performed. They did not have lights, curtains or other things that theatres have today. The 'magic' in the play had to be created by the actors and the words that Shakespeare wrote for them.

A Midsummer Night's Dream, which has been translated into almost every language and performed all over the world, is one of Shakespeare's most popular comedies.

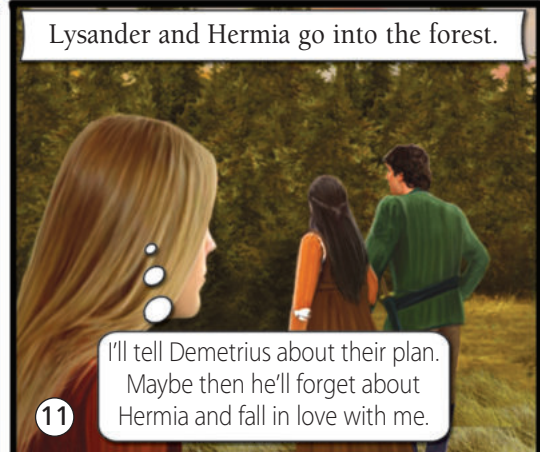
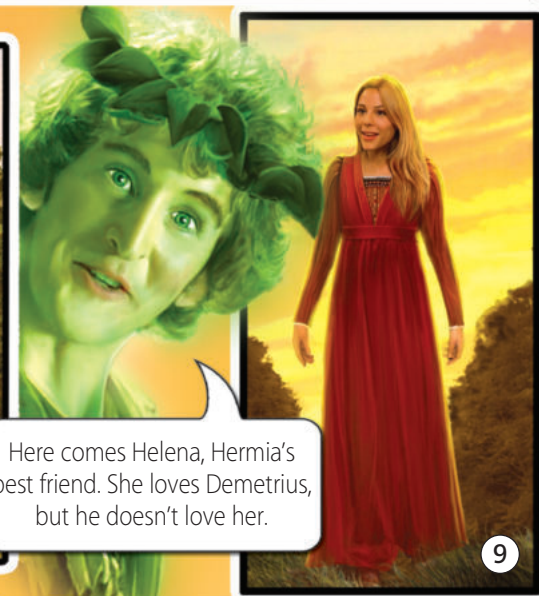
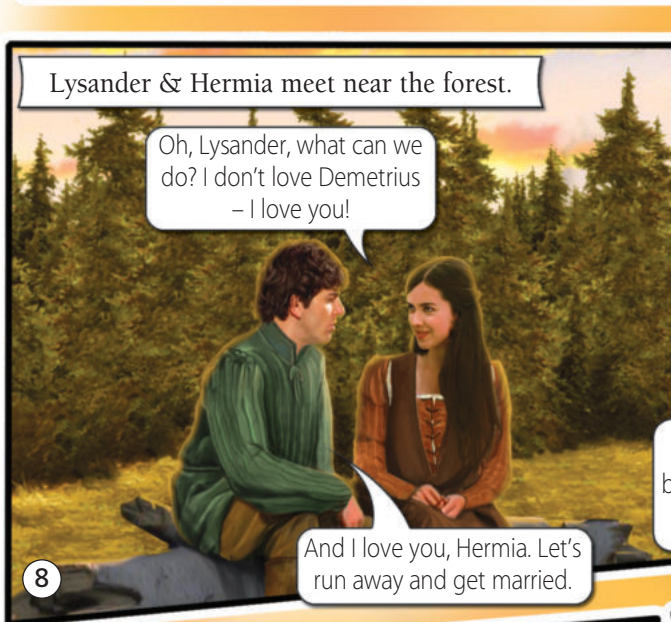
